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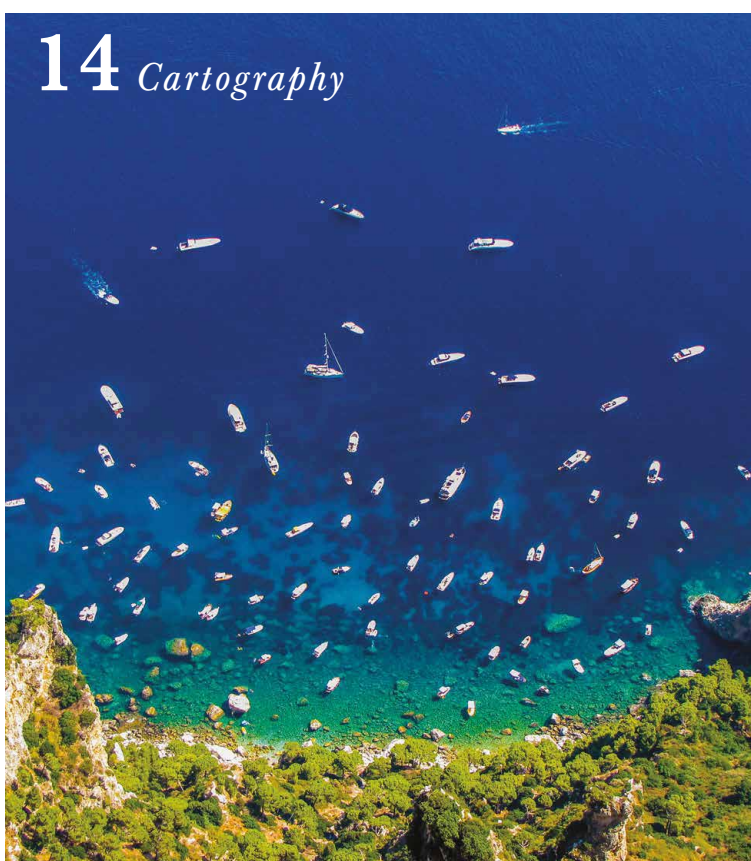
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SOUTHERN DALMATIAN ISLANDS

CLIMATE

The Islands of Dalmatia are characterised by a Mediterranean climate, dry in summer and mild in winter. The inland mountains protect Dalmatia from the continental climate of the Balkan interior, thus providing a mild climate especially along the southern coast.

WINDS

Between April and October, the prevailing wind is the Mistral (North-Westerly Wind), which blows from the North-West (NW). This wind starts to blow around 9-10am, blows intensely around noon, and ends at sunset. Finally, breezes also blow along the coasts during the day.

CURRENTS

Sea currents are fairly weak, strengthening only when the Sirocco (South-Easterly Wind) blows.

LANDSCAPES

The Dalmatian Islands are characterised by unspoilt nature, strong historical traditions, fishing and olive cultivation, beaches, and bays. Some places are very popular, but there are also many secluded bays.
