CLIMATE

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The climate of this area is typically Mediterranean. The Kornati Islands are moderately humid with dry winters and very hot summers. The mountain ranges shelter it from cold winds from the North (N). Cloud cover is greatest in winter months, with more cloudless days than cloudy days during the year. The highest rainfall occurs in October.

WINDS

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Bora (Northern to North-Eastern Katabatic Wind) is the most frequent wind in this area, while the strongest one is the warm and humid Jugo (South-Easterly Wind). The wind blowing from the sea to the mainland is predominant and there are never more than 5 consecutive days of strong wind, which are concentrated in December.

CURRENTS

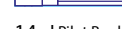
CURRENTS
Sea currents circulating in the Adriatic Sea in this area have a North-Westerly (NW) direction along the channels between the mainland and the islands. Tidal currents are generally weak and travel in a North-Westerly (NW) and South-Easterly (SE) direction.

Most of the Kornati Islands are uninhabited and almost completely devoid of vegetation, but lapped by an extraordinary crystal-clear cobalt blue sea that seems to almost illuminate them, and, for this reason, they are also called 'The Islands of the Moon'. A landscape of unparalleled beauty. Islands full of sheer cliffs and gorgeous inlets surrounded by unspoilt, wild nature.
